What You Need to Know

Eligibility

Applicants must be at least 16 years old and currently enrolled at one of the Global Partners in Education member institutions.

The Institution

The ECU Language Academy is an accredited English as a Second Language (ESL) academy associated with East Carolina University. In addition to the Summer English program, the academy offers an intensive program of academic English for degree-seeking students.

East Carolina University is an academic leader in the Southeast U.S., with several nationally recognized programs. ECU offers more than 100 undergraduate and 75 graduate programs, including schools of business, medicine, nursing and engineering.

Levels of English

Students are assigned to classes according to level of proficiency. Students with lower intermediate (B1) skills and above can be accommodated.

Visa

Students who require a visa are responsible for obtaining his or her own F-1 visa to attend.

Courses of Instruction

Students spend a minimum of 16 hours per week in the classroom, with intensive instruction in the areas of grammar, writing, and oral communication. During an additional 4-10 hours per week, students are engaged in a variety of academic, cultural and social activities in the ECU-Greenville area.

Housing

The program includes housing with a roommate in an on-campus ECU residence hall. Students wishing to live alone may do so at an additional expense.

Meals

The program includes three meals every weekday and two meals on weekends. For the occasional activities that include off-campus meals, students are responsible for their meals.

Excursions

Students can join two fun, optional weekend trips during the program, for the following additional fees:

Cost covers transportation, a one-night hotel stay, breakfast, dinner, and fees.
